

## THE TIKKUNTREE PROJECT:

growing peace stitch by stitch

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### TikkunTree “Safed” Leaf (knit flat with side seam)

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Here is a version of the “Safed Leaf” for knitters less comfortable with knitting in-the-round on double-point needles. This version (center) of the “Safed” Leaf pattern is knitted flat, on straight needles. Since it starts with an I-cord stem, I suggest using 8” double-point needles (2 of your set of size 6 needles dpns), but you can certainly switch to regular straight needles (9” or 13”) if you prefer.

#### Materials

- worsted weight green or gray yarn
- a set of size 6 double-point needles (I used 5” long needles for ease of working, but any length will do)
- a tapestry needle (to sew side seam)

#### Notes and abbreviations

- The pattern is based on a 17-stitch repeat (the large veined Tree Undone leaf), separated by a single k1
- **CO** = **cast on**, using the “knit-on” method (see illustrations below)
- **M1** = **yo** on the row in which the instruction occurs, **ktbl (knit through back loop)** or **ptbl (purl through the back loop)** on the next row, to make an invisible increase
- [**Sl2tog, k1, p2sso**] = slip 2 sts together knit-wise, as if knitting them together, knit next stitch, pass the slipped sts together over the knit st. This double-decrease produces the center vein of the leaf pattern

#### Directions

CO 5 sts. Work in I-cord (on double points) 4 rows.

Row 1: CO 8 sts. Knit to last st, kfb (14 sts)

Row 2: Knit

Row 3: \*KFB, K5, KFB\*, repeat \*\* (18 sts)

Row 4: purl

Row 5: \*PFB, P3, K1, P3, PFB\*, repeat \*\* (22 sts)

Row 6: knit

Row 7: \*KFB, K9, KFB\*, repeat \*\* (26 sts)

Row 8: purl

Row 9: \*PFB, P5, K1, P5, PFB\*, repeat \*\* (30 sts)

Row 10: knit

Row 11: purl

Row 12: knit

Row 13: \*PFB, P6, K1, P6, PFB\*, repeat \*\* (34 sts)

Row 14: \*P8, K1, P8\*, repeat \*\*

Row 15: knit

Row 16: purl

Row 17: \*P8, K1, P8\*, repeat \*\*

Row 18: \*K8, P1, K8\*, repeat \*\*

Rows 19-22: repeat rows 15-18

Row 23: \* K1, ssk, K11, k2tog, K1\*, repeat \*\* (30 sts)

Row 24: purl

Row 25: \*P1, p2tog, p4, k1, p4, ssp, P1\*, repeat \*\* (26 sts)

Row 26: \*K6, P1, K6\*, repeat \*\*

Row 27: \*K1, ssk, k7, k2tog, K1\*, repeat \*\* (22 sts)

Row 28: \*P1, p2tog, P5, ssp, P1\*, repeat \*\* (18 sts)

Row 29: \*P4, K1, P4\*, repeat \*\*

Row 30: \*K1, k2tog, K1, P1, K1, ssk, K1\*, repeat \*\* (14 sts)

Row 31: \*K1, ssk, K1, k2tog, K1\*, repeat \*\* (10)

Row 32: \*ssp, K1, p2tog\*, repeat \*\* (6 sts)

Row 33: K6

Row 34: \*slip 1, k2tog, p2sso\*, repeat \*\* (2 sts)

Row 34: p2tog.

Fasten off yarn, leaving a long enough tail with which to sew the side seam (10-12”).

Sew side seam to stem. Leave tails dangling.
